

## Jan 24, 2021 Monday with the Prof Q&A Discussion:

- After the presentation on 'religion' and 'belief', the question of whether or not "anger" was something physical or metaphysical. It was explained that human emotions are real manifestations but they are not entities that exist in the physical-realm. Instead, anger is a metaphysical ("beyond the physical") concept to explain the action we call "anger".
- It was then asked if our universe has an end/edge/limit to it, since modern science believes the universe is expanding. From a Christian worldview, there must be an edge to the universe since God does not live within time and space (aka the universe). Thus, God made the universe/cosmos separate from himself. The universe has a limitation, while God does not.
- Lastly, the topic on postmodernism and human experience came up; that is, what is the highest authority for people today? Well, postmodernism, in contrast to premodern and modern, believes the human 'mind' determines reality. So, whatever the person thinks is true, it is true for them but maybe not for you. Postmodernism is a form of Relativism. (This topic and more will be explored further in future Monday Nights.)
